

OPEN CLASS FLOWERS AND PLANTS

Department 115

RULES

1. Exhibits must be arranged and grown by the exhibitor, except the roadside and wood in weathered wood.
2. Only one exhibit per entry number.
3. Exhibitors must provide their own containers.
4. Entries will be displayed in the 4-H Forum. Judging time will be at 9:00 a.m. on Wednesday.
5. Entries will be accepted between 2:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. on Tuesday. No exhibits will be accepted after 8:00 p.m. Exhibits must be in place until 7:00 p.m. on Sunday.
6. Large flowers should be shown in proportionate sized containers; small flowers growing on short stems in low bowl, and tall flowers in vases.
7. Entries in **Class A** should **NOT** have additional foliage added.
8. Entries in **Class A and B** must be in clear containers. No additional foliage is to be added. Wedging is permitted. Wedging: use of small inconspicuous "plug" in neck of bottle to improve pose of specimen. i.e. plug of plastic wrap, styrofoam, wood, etc.
9. Entries in **Class C**:
 - a) Must be in good form to be viewed from all sides.
 - b) Entries must be fresh or natural dried products unless stated otherwise. Dried arrangements can only be entered one year.
 - c) No dyed or painted fresh material.
 - d) Entries may use any cultivated or wild foliage flower as a filler.
 - e) You may use fruits or vegetables in arrangements that have not been grown by the exhibitor.
10. Entries in **Class D** may be exhibited more than one year.
11. If name of plant is known in **Class D** – print it on entry ticket.
