JUNIOR BEEF **Department 202** **RULES**

1. Animals may be grade or purebred.
2. A maximum of four animals may be exhibited by a member, two of which must be owned by exhibitor. Proof of ownership will be determined by local 4-H Leader or FFA Advisors at the time of entry. Steers to be owned and registered by March 15th and ear tagged (a maximum of three (3) steers per exhibitor may be tagged) by April 15th. Animals shall be tagged with official fair tags available from the fair office and numbers listed on entry form. Once the steer has been tagged, it is MANDATORY to take a photo of the steer and either mail it in to the Fair Office (2417 Silvernail Road, Pewaukee, WI 53072) or email (waukfair@bizwi.rr.com). Photo should include exhibitors name and be sent no later than May 1st to be eligible to sell the steer in the auction.
3. Feed and bedding must be furnished by the exhibitor.
4. **Age Classification:**
Junior Calf is one born on or after January 1st of this year. The calf must be at least 4 months old at Fair time.
Senior Calf is one born between September 1st & December 31st last year.
Summer Yearling is one born between May 1st & August 31st last year.
Junior Yearling is one born between January 1st & April 30th last year.
Senior Yearling is one born between September 1st & December 31st two years ago.
2-year-old and older is one born before September 1st two years ago and shall have calved during the past year.
5. All animals must meet state health regulations listed under Wisconsin County, District and State Fairs Animal Health Rules and Regulations in this book.
6. Market Class animals will be divided into classes by weight. Divisions will be determined by the Superintendent. Enter steers in Class G by respective breed and approximate weight group. Only one animal per entry number.
7. Market Animals must be in place by 6:00 p.m. Wednesday for weighing.
8. Release time for livestock animals purchased at the auction will be Sunday at 7:00 p.m.
9. Animals sold at auctions that will be shown at State Fair must have the buyer sign a buyer release form.

10. Entry fee is \$5.00 per animal (non-refundable).
11. Beef will be judged Thursday.
12. Any class breed (steers) with less than four animals may be put into Class E at the discretion of the superintendent to combine classes.

Herdsmanship Awards will be made in two groups, large and small, divided according to the number of animals exhibited. The exhibit must be entered in the club name. Awards will be based on general appearance, neatness of exhibit, conduct and appearance of exhibitors, attendant in charge, storage of feed and equipment, identification of club, cattle type, quality of cattle, originality, and neatness of decorations. It is not necessary to enter Club Herdsmanship on your entry card. Decorations must not be removed before 7:00 pm Sunday, or disqualification or loss of award may result. Judges will be selected by the Waukesha County Agribusiness Council.

JUNIOR SWINE Department 203 RULES

1. All animals must meet state health regulations listed under Wisconsin County, District and State Fairs Animal Health Rules and Regulations in this book.
2. Market animals must be in place and identified by 6:00 p.m. Wednesday. Weigh-in will take place between the hours of 10:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m. by a weigh-in committee.
3. Market hogs must be tagged on the mandatory weigh-in-date(s) to be eligible for auction and Rate of Gain contest. Average weight at weigh-in has been 65 - 80 lbs. This is only a guideline. Animals will be tagged (maximum of three animals per exhibitor can be tagged) by the swine superintendent or livestock committee. No late entries will be allowed nor will they be allowed to sell at the auction. Weigh-in at the fairgrounds is mandatory – NO EXCEPTIONS. Weigh-in will be the 4th weekend in April: Saturday 9:00 a.m. – 1:00 p.m. and Sunday noon – 2:00 p.m. only.
4. All animals exhibited must be sold. Animals that are underweight or don't qualify for the Livestock Auction will be sold to a local stock yard.
No animals will be allowed to return home.
5. Entry fee is \$1.00 per animal (non-refundable).
6. A maximum of two pigs may be entered: market barrow or market gilt.
7. No re-weigh-ins will be allowed.
8. All swine shall have a minimum of ½ inch of hair to show and sell in the auction.
