Herdsmanship Awards will be made in two groups, large and small, divided according to the number of animals exhibited. The exhibit must be entered in the club name. Awards will be based on general appearance, neatness of exhibit, conduct and appearance of exhibitors, attendant in charge, storage of feed and equipment, identification of club, animal type, quality of animals, originality, and neatness of decorations. Decorations must not be removed before 7:00 p.m. Sunday, or disqualification or loss of award may result. It is not necessary to enter Club Herdsmanship on your entry card. Judges will be selected by Waukesha County Agribusiness Council.

**RULES**

1. Exhibitors are not to be coached from the rail. Encroachment of this rule may be cause for disqualification. Animals cannot be worked or ridden by anyone except the exhibitor while on the grounds. If assistance is needed, the parents or an older exhibitor may assist from the ground. **ASTM/SEI** helmets must be worn by all riders whenever mounted or driving.

2. Since this is a Junior Show, horses must be prepared for show by the exhibitor (this includes but is not limited to bathing, clipping, grooming, and braiding or banding the mane). Only 4-H members, other Waukesha County Fair youth exhibitors, Waukesha County 4-H volunteer, and family may assist in preparation at the fair. Failure to comply will result in not being able to show. The Waukesha County 4-H Horse Association (WC 4-H HA) will decide by majority vote.
3. Members may show a maximum of two (2) horses which must be registered with the WC 4-H HA at the Waukesha County Fair. **If enough stalls are NOT available, members will be limited to showing one horse. Horse and stall registrations are due May 31.**
4. All exhibitors may reserve up to two stalls (if available). Exhibitors are not allowed to stable or work out of a trailer. Stall deposits will be refunded if the stall is cleaned and approved by barn manager.
5. Animals exhibited may be owned or managed. Ownership is defined as being owned by the member or his/her immediate family. Managed is one that is fed, cared for and ridden at least 50% of the time by the member, but not owned by him or his/her immediate family.
6. An exhibitor may show in both the English and Western Divisions, except trail. **Only one trail class may be entered.**
7. Draft Horses may be exhibited in appropriate driving and showmanship classes on Friday. Exhibitors ages 11 and under must be accompanied by an adult while driving.
8. The horse show will follow the Wisconsin 4-H Horse Project Equestrian Guidelines. Copies can be found on the internet at [www.uwex.edu/ces/4h/onlinpro/horses.cfm](http://www.uwex.edu/ces/4h/onlinpro/horses.cfm) or obtained from your project leader.
9. No class changes will be allowed the day of the show.
10. Severe bits will be disqualified at the discretion of the judge.
11. No tie downs or martingales shall be allowed in show ring except in jumping class.
12. If it is deemed necessary to consult a veterinarian, the exhibitor is responsible for the fee.
13. All animals must meet State Health Requirements listed in the front of the book. A copy of current year negative Coggins Test must be provided with the stall registration form for the County Fair.
14. Horses must arrive by 6:00 p.m. on Wednesday and are required to stay until 7:00 p.m. on Sunday. Horses unable to meet this requirement for illness, injury, temperament, or safety reasons should not be brought to the County Fair. Animals that become sick, injured or dangerous while at the County Fair will be examined by the County Fair Veterinarian who will decide if the horse should be taken home. Only the County Fair Veterinarian is allowed to excuse a horse from the Fair Grounds. Late arrivals or early departures will result in the loss of premiums and will be given a pink ribbon.
15. Clubs are encouraged to have stall decorations. No crepe paper please. **STALL DECORATIONS MUST REMAIN UNTIL 7:00 P.M. ON SUNDAY. NO EXCEPTIONS.**

16. Decisions and rulings related to the Waukesha County Fair Junior Horse Show guidelines and rules will be made by fair superintendents and the chairman and vice-chairman of the Waukesha County 4-H Horse Association or their representatives.
17. All entrants must check in with the gatekeeper and remain in the area before the previous class ends. The gate will not be held for late arrivals.
18. The championship classes will consist of the two (2) top Blue ribbons from each eligible class.
19. In order to show at the County Fair, each horse project family must contribute two (2) hours of service at a schooling show or a circuit show **and** two (2) hours at the tack sale or open show.
20. All livestock being exhibited must be washed at the wash rack.

**INFORMATION REGARDING  
STATE 4-H HORSE EXPO**

**ELIGIBILITY** You must be a 4-H Horse Project member in good standing, must be in grades 6-13 this past school year, and have received a blue ribbon with your 4-H project horse in either Showmanship, Equitation, Pleasure Riding, Trail, Pleasure Driving, Reinsmanship, Obstacle Driving, Therapeutic Walk-Trot or Therapeutic Trail. Walk-Trot classes do not qualify for state. Horseless Horse members may qualify in Horseless Horse Walk-Trot equitation or pleasure. If you win in a Western, Hunt, or Saddleseat Class, you must show in that Western, Hunt, or Saddleseat Class at State. You must show the same horse at State with whom you received the blue ribbon at the County Fair. All Horse, Pony, and Horseless Horse members may enter the educational

activities. All 4-H State Horse Expo entries must be made, paid for, and have the necessary signatures at the County Fair no later than 5:00 p.m. Sunday. **JUNIOR POULTRY**  
**Department 207**

**RULES**

1. No exhibitor may exhibit more than 20 birds, by poultry class, breed and variety. Only one of each variety per age classification may be exhibited.
2. Age classifications. The date of hatching for determining the distinction between young and old is January 1st of the exhibit year. Age classification and Poultry categories are as follows:

3. A judging class may be combined or separated at the superintendent's discretion. If a class is divided, a minimum of five will constitute a judging class. Every effort shall be made so junior exhibitors can exhibit their specific variety of poultry.
4. Exhibitors entering the "**Any other**" fowl classes specify variety on entry form.
5. Exhibitors are to furnish their own feeding and watering equipment as well as feed for their birds.
6. Selling of birds other than in the Livestock Auction is prohibited. Any advertising or signs on cages are prohibited.
7. It is recommended that birds brought to the fair be kept separate from the flock for two weeks after returning home to insure freedom from disease.
8. Poultry must have been under the care of the exhibitor by May 1 of this year. Exemption of broiler Class C Entry 1.
9. For your birds' protection and pullorum testing, a numbered leg band is mandatory. The band should appear on the entry blank or submitted to the poultry superintendent when the birds are cooped.
10. All young pigeons must be banded with a seamless dated band.
11. Exhibitors entering Class E specify breed on entry form.
12. All poultry over 4 months of age and turkeys over 6 months of age, shall be accompanied by documentation of a negative test for pullorum-typhoid conducted within 90 days of arrival at the exhibition or originate from a flock designated as "U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid Clean". The test for turkeys is different than for chickens and must be done by someone certified to test turkeys or a veterinarian.
