

5. Exhibitors are responsible for the transportation to the butcher and delivery to the buyer.
6. Top placing birds will be eligible for auction if auction criteria are met:
  - A. Young Tom Turkeys, minimum weight of 20 lbs.
  - B. Young Hen Turkeys, minimum weight of 15 lbs.
  - C. Geese, standard weights, as listed for young goose and gander, in the APA standard of Perfection for heavy and medium class only.
  - D. Ducks, standard weights, as listed for young duck and drake, in the APA standard of Perfection for heavy and medium class only.
7. Broiler, Capons and Roaster chickens weights as listed in the Fairbook.
8. Poultry in Auction not for re-sale.

## **JUNIOR RABBITS**

### **Department 208**

**Also see Dept. 210 Class I for Educational Exhibits.**

#### **RULES**

1. No exhibitor may exhibit more than two breeds. No more than one entry per entry number.
2. All exhibits must have been under the care of the exhibitor since May 1st or since birth. All animals must be at least eight weeks of age.
3. Exhibitors must make sure cages have lime and shavings added and feed and water their rabbits by 10:00 a.m. daily. Exhibitors are to provide feed and equipment. If unable to check cage and feed and water on time, please contact your Rabbit Leader or another member from your club to do it for you.
4. Rabbits will be judged in the order that they are listed in the Premium Book starting at 9:00 a.m. on Thursday.
5. Exhibitors are responsible for keeping their club areas clean.
6. Rabbits must be tattooed on the left ear for identification. If you are unable to tattoo before the fair please contact the Superintendent when you check in.
7. Rabbits showing any signs of disease cannot be exhibited at the fair. If at any time an animal shows signs of any contagious or infectious disease, it shall be removed from the exhibit and slaughtered or quarantined as directed by the department.
8. No doe with young allowed at the fair. No rabbits can be at the show unless they are entered into the show.
9. Rabbits are to be brought to the fair by 8:00 p.m. on Wednesday. Rabbits brought in after 8:00 p.m. will receive an automatic fourth place. Rabbit check-in will begin at 1:00 p.m. Wednesday.
10. Exhibitors must sign up for a specific showmanship time on Wednesday at Fair Check-In.
11. Rabbits must stay for entire length of Fair, regardless of weather. Rabbits leaving early forfeit premium money.

12. Release time is 7:00 p.m. Sunday and all animals shall be picked up at that time. All members and parents are asked to help with take-down of the cages at that time.
13. Terms used as follows:
  - Fancy Breeds** include breeds used mainly for show and exhibition and have four (4) classes for the breed according to A.R.B.A.
    - Senior Buck** - 6 months and older
    - Senior Doe** - 6 months and older
    - Junior Buck** - under 6 months
    - Junior Doe** - under 6 months
  - Commercial Breeds** include breeds used mainly for meat and fur purposes, they have six (6) classes for each breed according to the A.R.B.A.
    - Senior Buck** - 8 months or older
    - Intermediate Buck** - 6 months and less than 8 months
    - Junior Buck** - Under 6 months
    - Senior Doe** - 8 months or older
    - Intermediate Doe** - 6 months and less than 8 months
    - Junior Doe** - Under 6 months
14. Judging will be done according to the standards for each breed.
15. Classes may be split at the discretion of the superintendent or judge due to size of class.
16. Cage fee of \$1.00 per entry, non-refundable.
17. Four (4) lots of Meat Rabbits will be chosen for the Livestock Auction. (Please see times and information).

**Rabbit Hopping Rules - Show Date & Time TBA**

1. Rabbit does not need to be pedigreed and can be a mixed breed.
2. All rabbits must be at least 5 months of age to compete.
3. Sick rabbits will not be allowed to compete or practice at meetings.
4. All rabbit breeds are welcomed but larger breeds are not recommended for the safety of the rabbit.
5. Handlers may only enter 2 rabbits per class.
6. Handlers are responsible for the training of their rabbit.
7. Any mistreatment of a rabbit will not be tolerated.
8. All rabbits must use the "H" style harness with clips or buckles and hook in the back. You will also need a 6' lead.
9. The rabbit and handler are considered a team. You may not hand your rabbit over to any one else during competition to compete in other events.
10. The rabbit must never be left unattended in the competition area.
11. A handler and rabbit may not advance to the next required class division until all necessary points are earned from previous course.

## **JUNIOR DOGS** Department 209 See also Dept. 210 Class F Rules

1. All dogs must be at least six months of age [purebred or mixed breed].
2. All dog exhibits must be the result of regular 4-H or FFA project works. A member may enter only their own dog or a dog that is a pet of their immediate family. Each member must have trained the dog which they enter. A member must show their dog in the class in which they have been trained for during the current year.
3. Dogs shall wear a chain, fabric, or leather slip collar or a buckle collar without tags, [no prong collars allowed] and shall be led with a leather or fabric lead preferably six feet long. Dogs will not be permitted off the lead except when being judged. Exhibitors must keep dogs under control at all times.
4. All Dogs are required to have had distemper, rabies, and parvo virus inoculations. Certificates of these inoculations must be presented to the leaders before any dog will be permitted to join the project training classes or to enter the Fair.
5. Sick dogs will not be permitted to compete at the Fair. Females in season to be exhibited last.
6. American Kennel Club obedience rules will apply in all classes.
7. Brace consists of two dogs and one handler [both must be owned by handler].
