RULES

1. Exhibitor may enter three cats which belong to the immediate family.
2. All cats must be vaccinated for rabies and distemper at least three weeks prior to date of show. A photocopy of the proof of rabies and distemper vaccinations must be sent to the Show Superintendent three weeks prior to the show with your cat entry. (If vaccination is due three weeks prior to judging, send copy of last vaccination and bring current copy to the show. Show Superintendent will send out a mailing to all Cat Project participants indicating show times and directions as to where proof of vaccinations should be sent.)
3. No whole males over eight months may be shown.
4. Cats will be judged on health, grooming, general appearance, etc.
5. Entries must be in good health and not show evidence of disease.
6. One exhibit per entry number.
7. No nursing or pregnant cats at the show.

HORTICULTURE FIELD CROPS - RULES

1. For a sheaf exhibit, cut several hundred stalks of clean straw with good ripe heads and strip off the leaves. Tie the stalks into a neat, attractive bundle and square off the end with knife or shears.
2. For a threshed grain exhibit, run a bushel through the fanning mill several times and provide a peck of plump uniform kernels.
3. When corn is exhibited before it is ripe, it is shown as bundles of four stalks. Stalks should be uniform in size and height and should have good ears of uniform maturity on shanks of uniform length. The ears should be uniform in height on the stalks, 3 to 3 1/2 feet from the bottom. Corn stalks must be exhibited in a plastic bag that is placed in a plastic pail.
4. One exhibit per entry number.
5. All entries must be tagged with the named variety of the crop.
