# OPEN CLASS FLOWERS AND PLANTS DEPARTMENT DEPARTMENT- 115 

## RULES

1. See Open Class General Rules.
2. Exhibits must be grown, groomed, arranged and labeled correctly by the exhibitor. All flowers and plants must be clean and free of insects and disease.
3. Entries will be displayed in the Arena. Judging time will be at 9:00 a.m. on Wednesday.
4. Exhibitors must provide their own containers.
5. Only one exhibit per entry number.
6. Entries will be accepted between 2:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m. on Tuesday. No exhibits will be accepted after 8:00 p.m. Exhibits must be in place until 7:15 p.m. on Sunday.
7. Large flowers should be shown in proportionate sized containers; small flowers growing on short stems in low bowl, long stem and spike flowers in tall containers.
8. Entries in Cut Flowers and Bouquets must be in clear containers. No additional foliage is to be added. Wedging is permitted. Wedging: use of small inconspicuous "plug" in neck of bottle to improve pose of specimen. i.e. plug of plastic wrap, styrofoam, wood, etc.
9. Entries in Artistic Arrangements:
a) Must be in good form to be viewed from all sides.
b) Entries must be fresh or natural dried products unless stated otherwise. Dried arrangements can only be entered one year.
c) No dyed or painted fresh material.
d) Entries may use any cultivated or wild foliage flower as a filler.
e) You may use fruits or vegetables in arrangements that have not been grown by the exhibitor.
f) Bouquet: a collection or cluster of flowers in a vase.
g) Arrangement: a planned composition of flowers with all around design, balance, shape and color
10. Entries in Houseplants may be exhibited more than one year. Print name of plant on entry tag. Plants must have been grown by the exhibitor at least 3 months before the fair.
11. Entries in Combination Plantings must be grown by the exhibitor in a container size 12 " or less. Print name of plant on entry tag.
