

I am going to the Waukesha County Fair



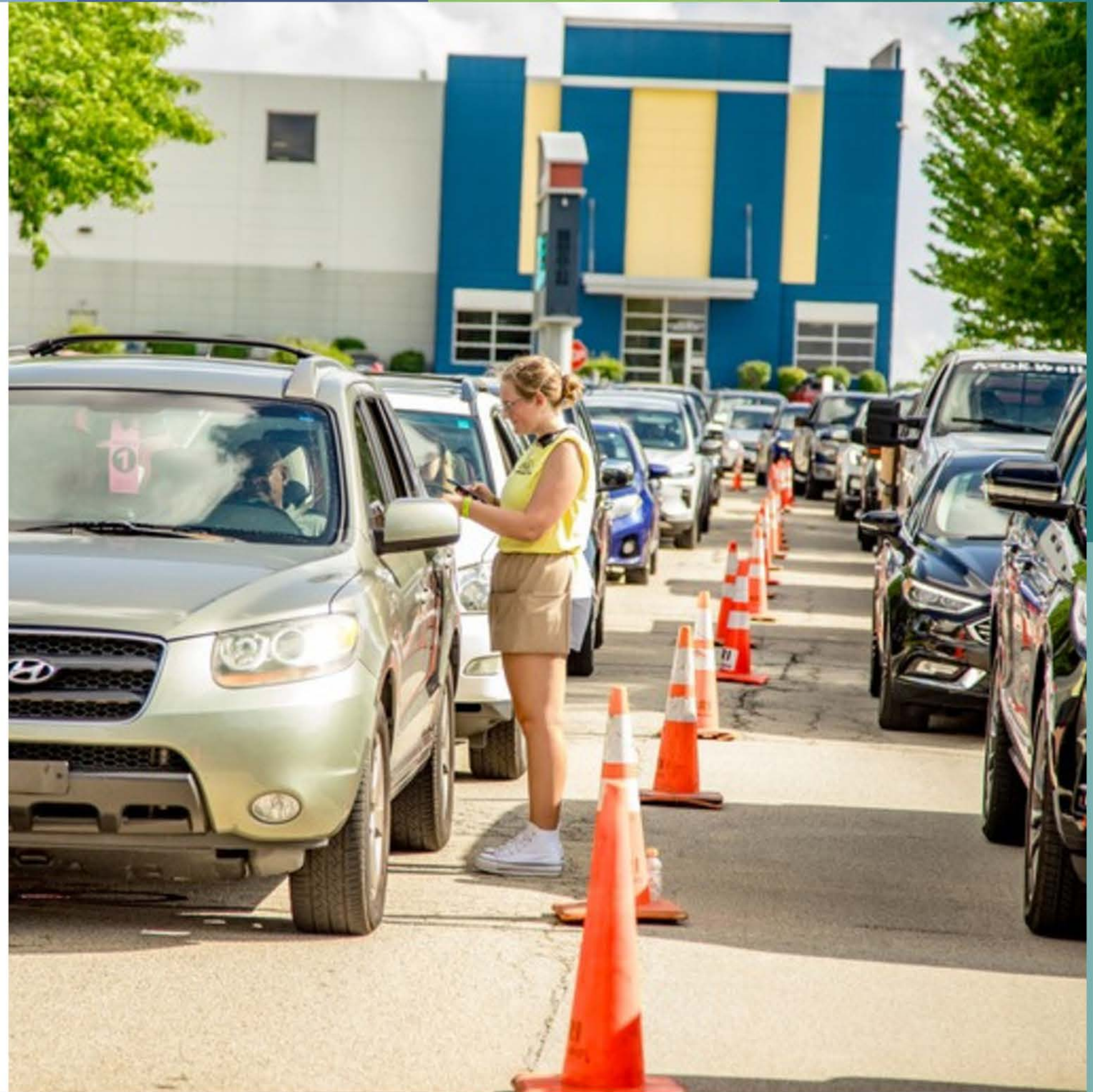
I will be a good listener and have fun at the Fair.
